Sharing a Mother—"God sent forth his son born of a woman" Galatians 4:4.

How appropriately we begin the new calendar year by celebrating the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God! "Yes, God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him may not die, but may have eternal life (John 3:16). This brief statement is a mysterious, but powerful manifestation of God's infinite love for us. He gave us his Son in a unique way. In giving us the greatest of all his gifts, his only Son, God provided a Mother for him that he might enter into our world. Our loving Father called Mary to be the Mother of his Son. He preserved her from all sin that she might cradle the sinless one in her womb. Mary's sinlessness gave her a great capacity to love. Her sinlessness removed all obstacles such as pride, self-centeredness, insecurity, doubt, fear and the host of barriers which prevent us from loving completely and without reservation. Such is the mystery of God's incomprehensible love. Mary responded to that outpouring with every fiber of her being. She wanted to make herself receptive to that divine love. She wanted to become a perfect temple for the Savior which she was to conceive by the power of the Holy Spirit.

How incongruous is God's love! He wanted his son to come into this world like any other child—fragile, needy, dependent, helpless, vulnerable, trusting. "God sent forth his Son, born of a woman." The Son of God is also the Son of Mary. She is the Mother of God, yet like her Child and because of her Child, she is poor, dependent, vulnerable. The message is plain. God comes into our world in weakness. His power is love, exemplified in his Mother's love. Redemption is accomplished through love, and love is always vulnerable, continued next week.



PRO-LIFE



Roe v. Wade is indefensible on every level. Will the Supreme Court admit it?

WASHINGTON (LifeSiteNews) — In a sane country with a Supreme Court committed to doing its job honestly, Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization would be a done deal. There wouldn't be any question that Mississippi's ban on abortion at 15 weeks was perfectly constitutional, nor would there be any doubt of a complete reversal of the past half-century of pro-abortion judicial precedent.

At its most basic level, the ban is lawful for the same reason Roe v. Wade is not: because absolutely nothing in the Constitution requires states to permit any abortions, and the principles the Constitution does affirm weigh heavily against violating the right to life. As a matter of biological fact, there is no serious question that the fetus is a living human being from the earliest moments of his or her existence. And as attorney Josh Craddock has exhaustively shown, the Constitution was built on a legal tradition which recognized that personhood exists before birth.

"By the time of the Fourteenth Amendment's adoption [in 1868], 'nearly every state had criminal legislation proscribing abortion,' and most of these statutes were classified among 'offenses against the person," Craddock notes. Further, the Fourteenth Amendment's drafters and sponsors, including Sen. Jacob Howard and Reps. Thaddeus Stevens and John Bingham, expressly declared that its promise of equal protection would apply not merely to those whose personhood had been previously recognized, but to, in Bingham's words, "any human being."

Justice Sonia Sotomayor found herself defending Roe expressly on the grounds that dumping Roe would mean the Court would have to similarly dump "so much that's not in the Constitution." Well ... yeah. That's kind of your job, remember?

But again, all of the above is what we would expect in a sane country with a Supreme Court committed to doing its job honestly. With the Supreme Court we actually have here in the real world, however, justices frequently make decisions they know are wrong based on other considerations: personal ideology, partisan politics, personal or institutional optics, you name it.
